Dear Parents/Carers,

I would like to begin by saying a huge thanks to everyone for supporting our Parent Consultation Day. The feed-back provided has been really positive. We believe the day worked well, allowing you to have quality time with your child's teacher. Your comments emphasised how useful and informative the meetings were and the time element allowed you to have more in-depth discussions with your child's teacher about their learning and progress.

Our class assemblies have been enjoyed by all so please do keep coming along as we want to celebrate and show-case what the children do. We received some very generous donations for the Harvest Assembly so thank you. The donations were sent to the local food bank and were greatly appreciated.

Elections for school council were held earlier this term. Representatives were elected from each class, (Year 2 to Year 6) and the children have already had meetings this term. We look forward to our school council members taking an active role and voicing their opinions and views which we value hugely.

The next few weeks are really busy as we lead up to the festive period so please do check the events/activities section. Whilst we continue to deliver all aspects of the curriculum and ensure children's learning continues at the same pace, we have incorporated a number of special activities for the children to enjoy and enhance their learning.

Curriculum update – our children in Early Years and Key Stage 1 have been introduced to Little Wandle Phonics to develop their early reading skills. The approach to teaching letters and sounds using the structured programme provides children with more scope to practice and secure their knowledge from the very start. Our aim remains to ensure children are able to read fluently by the time they join Key Stage 2. We have had some parent workshops and have others planned in the not too distant future to support parents.

Year 6 children have started the weekly booster sessions in preparation for SATs and hope children feel that the little bit of extra focus will support them further. We will be sharing additional information about SATs with parents at a workshop planned this half term.

May I remind parents to be considerate of where they park when collecting and dropping off children, as we have had a few of the local residents complaining of cars in front of driveways or blocking vehicles. Please respect our neighbours. KS2 dismissal time can get quite congested so please be mindful of each other when you collecting children. As a school we are looking at further options as to how this might be resolved. I will keep you updated.

Children's progress and learning is always our key priority, hoping of course, that everyone enjoys the rest of the term.
