

Website and Cookies Policy

To make this site simpler, we sometimes place small data files on your computer. These are known as cookies. Most big websites do this too.

Our cookies help us:

- Make our website work as you'd expect
- Improve the speed/security of the site

We do not use cookies to:

- Collect any personally identifiable information (without your express permission)
- Collect any sensitive information (without your express permission)
- Pass data to advertising networks
- Pass personally identifiable data to third parties
- Pay sales commissions

We collect web statistics automatically about your visit to our site. This information is used to help us follow browsing preferences so that we can improve our website. These statistics do not contain personal data and cannot be traced back to an individual.

We do not use cookies to store personal data or link non-personal information stored in cookies with personal data about specific individuals. Our cookies aren't used to identify you personally. They're just here to make the site work better for you. Indeed, you can manage and/or delete these small files as you wish.

crfstoken	Prevents cross site request forgery.
sessionid	Used for logging into the website.

Use of IP addresses and cookies

We collect IP addresses only for the purposes of system administration and to audit the use of our site. We do not link IP addresses to anything personally identifiable, which means that while your user session will be logged you will remain anonymous to us.

Measuring website usage (Google Analytics)

We use Google Analytics to collect information about how people use this site. We do this to make sure it's meeting its users' needs and to understand how we could do it better.

Google Analytics stores information about what pages you visit, how long you are on the site, how you got here and what you click on. We do not collect or store your personal information (e.g. your name or address) so this information cannot be used to identify who you are.

_utmt	Optimiser
_utmz	Stores information on how the site was reached (e.g. direct or via a link, organic search or paid search)
_ga	Identifies unique users
_gat	Throttles the request rate
_gid	Distinguishes users
